

## Teach for Texas Loan Repayment Assistance Program Application Information and Instructions

Please carefully read the following information before completing your application.

The purpose of the Teach for Texas Loan Repayment Assistance Program is to recruit and retain classroom teachers in communities and subjects for which there is an acute shortage of teachers in Texas.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

Applicants must:

- > Be currently teaching full time at the preschool, primary, or secondary level in a Texas public school;
- Be certified in a field identified by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) as experiencing a shortage of teachers during the academic year for which the application is submitted and teach full time in that field <u>or</u>
  - Be certified and teach full time at a campus identified by TEA as having a shortage of teachers during the academic year for which the application is submitted; and
- > Submit a completed application to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) during the annual application period between April 1st and June 15th for teaching service being completed during the current academic year.

#### Loan Repayment Assistance

- Loan repayment assistance received through this program will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service.
- > A teacher may not receive loan repayment assistance through this program for more than five years.
- Annual loan repayment awards are disbursed to lenders after all applications have been reviewed and ranked.

#### **Priorities for Ranking Applications**

Due to limited funding and the high level of interest in this program, we anticipate receiving many more applications from eligible teachers than we will be able to fund. Applications will be ranked according to the following criteria, in priority order:

- 1). Renewal applicants shall be given priority over first-time applicants unless a break in service periods has occurred;
- 2). Severity of shortage of teachers in the community or teaching field, as indicated below, in priority order:
  - a) Applicants who are teaching shortage subjects at campuses having the highest percentages of students receiving reduced and free lunches.
  - b) Applicants who are teaching any subject at campuses having the highest percentages of students receiving reduced and free lunches.
- 3). Financial need as evidenced by the total amount of student loan indebtedness. (Note: Funding may not allow for this priority to be a factor).

#### **Eligible Loans**

- Must be evidenced by a promissory note which required the loan proceeds to be used to pay higher education costs;
- Must not be in a default status.

#### **Teacher Shortages**

Designated Shortage Campuses:

The federal Title I designation is <u>not</u> used to determine campus eligibility for the Teach for Texas Loan Repayment Assistance Program. Shortage campus designation for this program is based on information provided annually by Texas Education Agency. A link to the current list of shortage campuses is posted on the program web page.

Designated Shortage Fields for 2013-2014:

Bilingual Education/ESL, Mathematics, Science, Foreign languages, Computer Science, and Special Education.

#### **Application Instructions**

- 1. Complete all of Part 1, Section A of Part 2, and all of Part 3.
- 2. Have your Chief Administrative Officer, (principal, assistant principal or superintendent) complete Section B of Part 2.
